

CAMP RULES

- 1 The camp kitchen is out of bounds to everyone at all times.
- 2 Cabin toilets and showers of the opposite sex are strictly out of bounds, this includes husbands and wives.
- 3 No smoking in any buildings at any time.
- 4 No portable music devices, ipad's, or similar, around the camp unless required as part of the programme or used as a communication aid. Please ensure cell phones are turned off during meetings.
- 5 Everyone is expected to attend all meetings and meal times unless medically unfit and has leave from their cabin leader.
- 6 All campers are required to be in their cabin/motel/lodge by curfew and remain there throughout the night, unless requiring medical attention or to use the toilets.
- 7 The swimming pool is strictly off bounds outside of assigned swim times.
- 8 All people with disability must be accompanied by a helper whilst in the pool.
- 9 Throwing or pushing people into the pool is not allowed.
- 10 After Supper swimming is for able-bodied helpers only (14yrs and over). The cabin leader must be informed and your disabled buddy must be in bed and comfortable. Everyone must toilet and dress for bed in the pool changing rooms. They must be in their cabin/motel/lodge by curfew.
- 11 After lights out, noise around the camp must be kept at zero level as people need their sleep.

Code of Conduct for all Camp Participants

- 1 Campers are expected to respect and abide by the authority, directions and instructions of the Camp Leaders.
- 2 Campers are to have the prior consent of the person before assisting or helping that person.
- 3 Campers are to abide by the rules of the Campsite.
- 4 Campers must ensure the well being and safety of all campers and in particular, those with disabilities are protected and safeguarded from any danger of abuse. For this reason,
 - A - Campers are not permitted to meet alone in secluded locations or situations.
 - B - Campers may not be involved in assisting with toileting or ablutions unless they are of the same gender. Where circumstances dictate that a caregiver of the opposite gender has to be involved, a second helper is to be present to ensure safety.
 - C - Campers may not touch anyone in an inappropriate way or behave in a way that is offensive, abusive or potentially sexual.
- 5 If any camper has concerns with the behaviour of another participant, they are to refer that matter of concern to their cabin leader. If it is a minor problem, the cabin leader is to take appropriate action. Any major behavioural problems must be reported to the Camp Director, who is then responsible for taking appropriate action.
- 6 Campers are to respect the confidentiality of any personal information they receive from any other participant, except where the life or safety of a person, or others is at risk; in which case, they will notify the Camp Director.
- 7 Campers are not to seek to gain information from another participant who is not willing to share it with them.
- 8 If a camper is injured, a helper is required to ensure that one person stays with the injured person whilst another notifies the Camp Nurse, or the Camp Doctor.
- 9 All visitors to the camp are required to abide by the Code of Conduct.
- 10 Campers are to value, respect and support all other participants at camp.

Any breach of the above Code of Conduct ultimately becomes the responsibility of the Elevate Christian Disability Trust board.
