

CAMP RULES

- 1 The camp kitchen is out of bounds to everyone at all times.
- 2 Cabin toilets and showers of the opposite sex are strictly out of bounds, this includes husbands and wives.
- 3 No smoking in any buildings at any time.
- 4 Any devices brought to camp are the responsibility of the individual bringing them. Please ensure cell phones are on silent during meetings.
- 5 All campers and volunteers are required to be in their cabin/motel/lodge by curfew and remain there throughout the night, unless requiring medical attention or to use the toilets.
- 6 The swimming pool is strictly out of bounds outside of assigned swim times.
- 7 Children under 14 years of age must be supervised in the pool. And non-competent swimmers must be accompanied whilst in the pool. Throwing or pushing people into the pool is not allowed.
- 8 After 10:30pm (lights out), noise around the camp must be kept at zero level as people need their sleep.
- 9 Due to the sensitive nature of camps smoke detectors, we ask that campers do not use body spray in any rooms as this can activate the sensors.
- 10 The speed limit around camp is 15kph
- 11 Alcohol, illegal drugs, firearms, and chewing gum are not permitted onsite

Code of Conduct for all Camp Participants

- 1 Campers and volunteers are expected to respect and abide by the authority, directions and instructions of the Camp Leaders.
- 2 Campers and volunteers are to have the prior consent of the person before assisting or helping that person.
- 3 Campers and volunteers are to abide by the rules of the Campsite.
- 4
To ensure the wellbeing and safety of all campers and volunteers the following applies:
 - A - Campers and volunteers are not permitted to meet alone in secluded locations or situations.
 - B - Campers and volunteers may not be involved in assisting with toileting or ablutions unless they are of the same gender. Where circumstances dictate that a caregiver of the opposite gender has to be involved, a second helper is to be present to ensure safety.
 - C - Campers and volunteers may not touch anyone in an inappropriate way or behave in a way that is offensive, abusive or potentially sexual.
- 5 If any camper or volunteer has concerns with the behaviour of another participant, they are to refer that matter of concern to their cabin leader. If it is a minor problem, the cabin leader is to take appropriate action. Any major behavioural problems must be reported to the Camp Director, who is then responsible for taking appropriate action.
- 6 Campers and volunteers are to respect the confidentiality of any personal information they receive from any other participant, except where the life or safety of a person, or others is at risk; in which case, they will notify the Camp Director.
- 7 Campers and volunteers are not to seek to gain information from another participant who is not willing to share it with them.
- 8 If someone is injured, ensure that one person stays with the injured person whilst another notifies the Camp Nurse, or the Camp Doctor.
- 9 All visitors to the camp are required to abide by the Code of Conduct.
- 10 Campers and volunteers are to value, respect and support all other participants at camp.

Any breach of the above Code of Conduct ultimately becomes the responsibility of the Elevate Christian Disability Trust board.
